

A HEALTHY DOWNTOWN IS KEY TO A STRONG COMMUNITY

The St. Joseph Downtown Community Improvement District is fully committed to support and assist in sustaining the viability of the district by making meaningful investments in the downtown area.

The St. Joseph Downtown Community Improvement District (CID) was formed on September 6, 2011 as a special taxing district to improve the downtown area.

Funding for the district is provided by a half cent sales tax and a property tax equivalent to fifty cents per one hundred dollars of property valuation.

The total taxes generated in the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2022 was \$137,200.61

In 2021-2022, the Downtown Community Improvement District contributed \$96,860.80 toward the cultural and economic activities assisting in the continued development of downtown.
